


From the Athletic Director



Santa Clara's Institute for Sports Law and Ethics ("ISLE"), a unique collaboration involving Santa Clara's Athletic Department, the Santa Clara Law School and Santa Clara's Markkula Center for Applied Ethics, awarded its first national award for sportsmanship at a formal dinner at Santa Clara's Adobe Lodge on May 1. The event was emceed by Tom Ferry of ESPN, and was attended by, among others, ISLE board members Brent Jones, Ronnie Lott and Brandi Chastain, as well as many other Bay Area sports notables, including representatives from the Sharks, A's and 49ers.

This new annual honor has been dubbed the "ETHOS" award, which, in addition to being an

acronym for ethics of sports, is also a Greek word that means "character". It will be awarded annually by ISLE to an individual or organization whose action, initiative or program contributed to furthering the ethics of sport in the United States.

The first recipient is Jim Thompson and his organization – The Positive Coaching Alliance – which for the past 15 years has been working aggressively nation-

wide to transform the culture of youth sports away from the "win at all costs" mentality into a much more positive, nurturing, character-building experience. They are moving the dial. Jim's organization has conducted more than 10,000 workshops at over 1,700 schools, leagues or other youth sports organizations impacting more than 4.5 million young adults and kids.

I am a firm believer in the rare and unique ability of sports to teach critical life lessons that are often not otherwise easily learned. I think we've assembled a great collection of coaches here at

Santa Clara who not only believe that just as fervently as I do, but practice it daily as their life's work. Unfortunately, both in my role here observing intercollegiate athletics today and in my involvement with my own three kids' participation in youth sports, all too often I witness first-hand the destructive impact that a misguided coach or program can have on the participants involved. We've seen some high-profile cases of misguided coaches attracting national attention lately, but there are countless similar examples across the country in youth sports that, while equally as damaging, might go unreported and perhaps even unnoticed. Against this backdrop, we couldn't be more proud to honor Jim and the Positive Coaching Alliance as our first recipient of the ETHOS Award. I think that makes a strong statement about what both our organization and the award are all about – setting an ambitious standard and tone for future recipients.
